


In April we will again hold our Easter dance, see the advert. Dress colourfully for this and enjoy Hot Cross Buns in a brightly decorated hall.



ALLABOUT SQUARES CLUB HISTORY – CALLER ANDREA BRAUN


I grew up in Geelong with a love of sport and played competitive Tennis. Through other players at our local club I was introduced to Square Dancing and soon became a regular club member. When they held an amateur callers night I keenly participated and discovered a new direction within the activity. I was encouraged by other callers who would kindly allow me a call when visiting their clubs.

In 1998 I travelled to the UK and attended the National Convention in Birmingham and had my first opportunity of calling in front of a large group of dancers. An opportunity arose to work in England and I became a trainee caller with Jim Rowland calling regularly at both Sheffield Swingers and Phoenix Squares in Sheffield. On return to Australia I began "Allabout Squares" in Geelong Victoria which ran from 2000 until 2005 until I relocated to South Australia.

In February 2008 "Allabout Squares" was reinvented and runs every week during school terms in Mount Gambier and celebrates its 10th birthday this March. Whilst living in Mount Gambier I have also taught Square Dancing at my son's local primary school with a fantastic response from the teachers and students. Square Dancing has afforded me many opportunities to combine dancing with travel and I have been privileged to attend and call at numerous conventions and clubs in England, USA, Sweden and Hawaii and New Zealand. In July 2016 I was fortunate to re-visit England and call both in York and at my old club in Sheffield. I also attended my first Callerlab Convention in San Antonio in Texas in 2003.

I have also recorded for several companies including Blue Star, Crown Records and became a resident caller for Shindig Productions.

I currently live on my beautiful 5 acre property just outside Mt Gambier with my amazing son James, two sheep, six chooks and my cat Ash.

St Patrick Fact 1

Patrick was a 5th-century Romano-British Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland. Much of what is known about Saint Patrick comes from the Declaration, which was allegedly written by Patrick himself.

It is believed that he was born in Roman Britain in the fourth century, into a wealthy Romano-British family. His father was a deacon and his grandfather was a priest in the Christian church.

According to the Declaration, at the age of sixteen, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders and taken as a slave to Gaelic Ireland. It says that he spent six years there working as a shepherd and that during this time he "found God". The Declaration says that God told Patrick to flee to the coast, where a ship would be waiting to take him home. After making his way home, Patrick went on to become a priest.

We had a great time dressing up in blue to celebrate Wild Frontier's 45th Birthday. That is quite an achievement for the club.


The next big event is our joint Weekend Away in Berri which is always relaxing and fun.

At time of writing we have not yet celebrated our Birthday so I will report on that next time.


Important note: due to a rise in hall costs, dance admission will be \$8 per person from the first dance in March.



Shirley and David Gabb—A Square Dance Bio

In August 1991 David Gabb was asked by Olive Hosking (Cowell) to help her out with learning a couple of moves! That did it! From there we found a Club in Whyalla where our two daughters were welcomed to learn Square Dancing.

We started dancing in 1991 with John Rix and Jo Sarinopoulos in a wonderful group called The Double 'J's. John and his wife Marjorie worked with us twice a week to get us to a level where we could attend the Perth National Convention in 1993. From here, we never looked back. We danced at the Whyalla Square Dance Club with Caller Chris Browning, and down at the Cowell Twirlers once a month, and many of our group travelled to help this Club out. Four of their dancers came to Whyalla to dance with us each Sunday night and after 4 years, Olive started the Cowell Twirlers. In

1995, John Rix asked Shirley to learn to call for the Club, so we could have variety. Up to this stage, we danced to records and tapes. Over a couple of years and many trips to Adelaide, we finally had a Caller for our Double 'J's! Generally we danced to more than two squares and were a tightly knit group. Each year we demonstrated at the Hospital Fete and the Whyalla Show. The highlight of each year was taking two sets down to the State Convention.

During all of these years, Jeff Seidel was the steadying influence with such patience and support, it was unbelievable. Thank you Jeff, and thank you too for the continued friendship over this time.

St Patrick Fact 2

According to tradition, Patrick returned to Ireland to convert the pagan Irish to Christianity. The Declaration says that he spent many years evangelising in the northern half of Ireland and converted "thousands". Patrick's efforts against the druids were eventually turned into an allegory in which he drove "snakes" out of Ireland (Ireland never had any snakes).

Tradition holds that he died on 17 March and was buried at Downpatrick. Over the following centuries, many legends grew up around Patrick and he became Ireland's foremost saint.

Why Green?

On St Patrick's Day, it is customary to wear shamrocks, green clothing or green accessories (the "wearing of the green"), the colour associated with Catholics in Ireland (orange is the colour associated with Protestant Christians). St Patrick is said to have used the shamrock, a three-leaved plant, to explain the Holy Trinity to the pagan Irish.

The colour green has been associated with Ireland since at least the 1640s, when the green harp flag was used by the Irish Catholic Confederation. Green ribbons and shamrocks have been worn on St Patrick's Day since at least the 1680s
