

We are saddened to hear of Zaree's passing and condolences go to fellow Paddle Steamers dancers. Zaree will be surely missed.






Some members travelled to Naracoorte for Acey Squares birthday dance which they enjoyed immensely.

A country wholesome supper, showed we could do it right A very happy birthday - a fantastic, happy night. !!



Treasurer's Report

The Report was published in the Round Up. Don Stephens explained the reasons for the three accounts – General Account, National Learners Fund and Future Conventions Trust Account.
