
I hope everyone is keeping virus free, don't know anyone personally who has had it I am glad to say, hopefully it is not too long before we are all meeting on the dance floor again.

Across

- 5 Face the centre of the formation and walk forward passing the other dancers in the line
- 6 From an Ocean wave end and centre turn 1/2, then new centres turn 3/4 and ends move forward to meet
- 8 From a couple, active dancer moves forward in a semi circle, the adjacent dancer steps into the vacated spot
- 9 From lines of four facing out, left hand couple steps forward then both wheel 180 towards the centre
- 10 From any tandem, lead dancer turns away from centre walking a full circle, trailing dancer takes their place
- 11 In a box formation, one dancer walks forwards as the other dodges sideways into the adjacent spot
- 12 A couple turns left 180 degrees pivoting on their handhold
- 14 Dancer on the right rolls across in front of the other dancer,

Down

- 1 From facing couples each couple moves to their left then forward
- 2 Half a trade
- 3 Ends cross fold as the centres fold in behind the ends to follow them around
- 4 From facing couples, right hand dancers go to centre and turn by right arm, bring the opposite dancer back as they return to their starting position
- 6 From a box circulate position, dancers facing in step in, arm turn by half and step forward. The other dancer runs to replace the first dancer
- 7 The left hand dancer escorts their partner around the circle the designated amount, then faces in
- 13 Facing dancers pass right shoulders, slide sideways back to back then walk backwards to face



Our learners were doing so well. We had


welcomed some more new learners. Thank you to the angels that come along to help them, I am sure the learners are helped by your experience.
