The Sub-Committee has reviewed the Society "Objectives" and have added/modified the highlighted sub-sections as per below.

Is there something that we have overlooked that you feel should be included or removed. Please forward any comments that have to our Sub-Committee Secretary or Chairman.

3. OBJECTIVES

3.1.	To encourage and foster the development of the Square Dance movement in South Australia.
3.2.	To publicise and create an appreciation of modern Square Dancing
3.3.	To organise the State Convention and Society/Combined Dances and encourage the clubs to organise and participate in joint club ventures.
3.4.	To develop friendship, unity between Square Dance Clubs. <mark>other</mark> Dance Clubs and dancers.
3.5.	To foster the formation of new Square Dance Clubs particularly in areas where no club exists.
3.6.	To provide opportunities to assist clubs financially where possible, particularly with learner classes,
3.7.	To support and liaise with National and Interstate Square Dance bodies.

Next month we will release some more Constitution Clauses that we have been working on for your review and comments.

Your input is much appreciated as this will assist us greatly in compiling a document that that will fulfil the members needs and requirements.

TAMINATIONS - Dance on your computer! Keep sharp and entertained whilst not dancing! Graham Elliott - May 2020

No doubt there are some dancers who are already familiar with this and most callers have used this at some time or other. However, for those dancers not aware of it, I'd like to show you some fun and good square dance knowledge you can gain using a free web based program available to anyone. A phone app version is also available.

It's called Taminations and is a program that contains definitions of square dance movements with animated pictograms to demonstrate them. It also contains a "sequencer" which allows you to type in a call and watch the dancers execute it. Then type in another and another and so on. The timing is very similar to how we dance. Let me elaborate:

Where is it?

In your internet address bar type in www.tamtwirlers.org/taminations OR - Google search for Taminations For smartphones, look for Taminations in your app store.

Who runs it?

It was created and is maintained by Brad Christie from the Tam Twirlers Square Dance Club in California. It's not affiliated with any dance or caller organisation but does use the universally accepted Callerlab definitions It is widely used by callers and dancers alike to check definitions and traffic patterns of the movements. I, like many callers, can attest to being bailed up by a dancer with a smartphone pointing out something they checked on Taminations!

Once you have opened the program. You'll see the "Welcome to Taminations" page as in the diagram below:

Now, press the "Play" button circled in the above diagram ...

The dancers execute the movement!


By trying different starting formations on the left of screen you can see the movement executed from these set ups. Explore the screen and see other options available.

Now the real fun part - the Sequencer!

Go back to the home screen by licking on the little icon in the top left of screen.



At the bottom of the screen on the left you'll see a button called "Sequencer". Click it to arrive this next screen:



From the page called "Taminations Sequencer" you can enter calls in the box at the top left (highlighted above) and hit "Enter" after each one. (Note you need to start with HEADS or SIDES then the movement for the first call so the program knows who to move). The dancers will dance the move. Then enter another call and hit enter. Again they dance. The fun part comes when you have entered a few calls, you can hit the "play" button and they dance all the moves without stopping. So, try and make a dance work by entering call after call. The program will tell you if it won't work. If you want a real test, try yourself by getting people back to their corner.

Use other buttons like Undo and Reset to clear entries.

Just have fun - these dancers won't complain!




