


SASDS COMMITTEE NEWS



One thing for sure our suppers may never be the same again. I certainly miss the smorgasbord of sweet and savoury delights to choose from.,



We are up and running again for the New Year and we hope everyone enjoyed our Aussie night and BBQ dinner held at the end of January.



The Twirlers started back dancing on the 15th of January with 20 dancers turning up. Some of our members


