CALLERLAB & SQUARE DANCE NEWS AROUND THE WORLD

From Graham Elliott

I wanted to share news from my observations on recent meetings of the international square dance community. This is really just to allow you to see how things are overseas and to share developments in the review of our programs.

I have been a member of Callerlab's Basic/Mainstream committee and International Advisory committee (IAC) for a number of years. The Basic/Mainstream committee is one that reviews our program lists every three years to determine if calls should be added or dropped and also maintain the definitions. The IAC enables reps from various countries to have input to what Callerlab are doing.

The pandemic can have a silver lining! For years these committees have operated via emails - including voting. Over the past 12 months the introduction of Zoom technology has allowed us all to meet "virtually" face to face for the first time. Whilst I generally much prefer real face to face, this is a good tool for overseas contacts who normally wouldn't be able to see each other.

The Basic/Mainstream Committee

The first virtual meeting was held early on a Monday morning in March this year, and 59 members attended from around the globe. That in itself is quite an input to the committee. There were reps from Europe, UK, Canada, Japan, Australia and of course the USA

Right now we are in the middle of a triennial review of the Basic/Mainstream lists. So far there's only a minor tweak to the Basic list and the Mainstream list that is still under discussion. I'll publish results as they are finalised. Overall it seems that there won't be any major changes as people really just want to get back to dancing. There are talks of trying reduced programs (shorter than Mainstream) to get people into dancing quicker & that discussion is ongoing.

IAC

In this forum we share what's happening around the world and our last meeting, late one Thursday night in March, again saw reps from many countries attending. Australia is well underway with square dance Covid recovery yet most other countries still cannot dance. Some because of social distancing requirements, others because hall landlords won't permit them. There are hopes for a return once vaccine rollouts get underway but many are still talking later in the year. People are compensating by holding virtual dances and callers are sharing information via Zoom seminars. We are truly blessed in that we can dance here!

CALLERLAB & SQUARE DANCE NEWS AROUND THE WORLD continued

Overall I see our influence on decisions to do with programs is still small and Callerlab by its very nature takes time to embrace change.

However, that won't stop us trying and perhaps more "virtual" participation by countries outside of the USA will start to generate more ripples of change.


We were lucky to have Christine H. make some scrolls & custard slices. All very yummy.
