This differs significantly from their <u>recommendation</u> that all persons aged between 18 and 64 should have one booster three months after their second dose. With a few of us being 65 or more SA Health are further recommending an additional Winter booster. The boosters are currently being highly promoted on both the television and the internet. Anyone who wishes to clarify further should call SA Health on 1300 232 272, select 3, then select 1.

kept on for the June Dinner. We welcome additional bookings if anyone would like to join us for the dinner.




The dreaded Covid continues to plague the South East. Our group have been reasonably lucky with only Robert a couple

Congratulations to those who have danced with me for their ten year award, Karen and Murray, Angie and to Jim who has rarely missed a


day. How things have changed over that period of time. I started with a second hand record player and tape deck, then in came mini discs, which I still use, and now computers which have given me quite a few headaches.
